MORE OPTIONS FOR NEXT YEAR

• TEACHER/OFFICE AIDE

 Requirements: Be on track to graduate, request permission from teacher, fill out form, get signatures, and submit to counseling by March 1, 2024.

- EARLY GRADUATION

 Requirements: Plan must be submitted by December of student's junior year. Early graduation means completion of HS credits by December of senior year.

- 3. Chemistry, Physics, AP Physics, AP Bio, Physical Science, Environmental Science, Essentials of A & P, Human A & P, KSU Chemistry & Lab, KSU Physics & Lab (Full Year)
- 4. American History or AP American History (Full Year)

Suggestions for remaining classes: Fine Art and/or Computer Literacy if not already taken; Intro/Technical Level Career Pathway Course (1 or 2 Sem); World Language (Full Year); Oral Communication if not already taken
